

Creative Title of Essay with the Right Words Capitalized but Not Underlined

This paper/essay is typed using Times New Roman and size 12 font. I realize that making the font huge will not fool Mrs. Bertolini, because she is not an idiot. My writing is double-spaced (which I did in the Microsoft Word program by selecting Format: Paragraph: Line spacing: Double from the pull down menu). I have indented (by hitting the tab key once) at the start of each and every new paragraph. Every paper/essay has 3 clearly indented paragraphs. Each of my paragraphs has at least 5 sentences.
